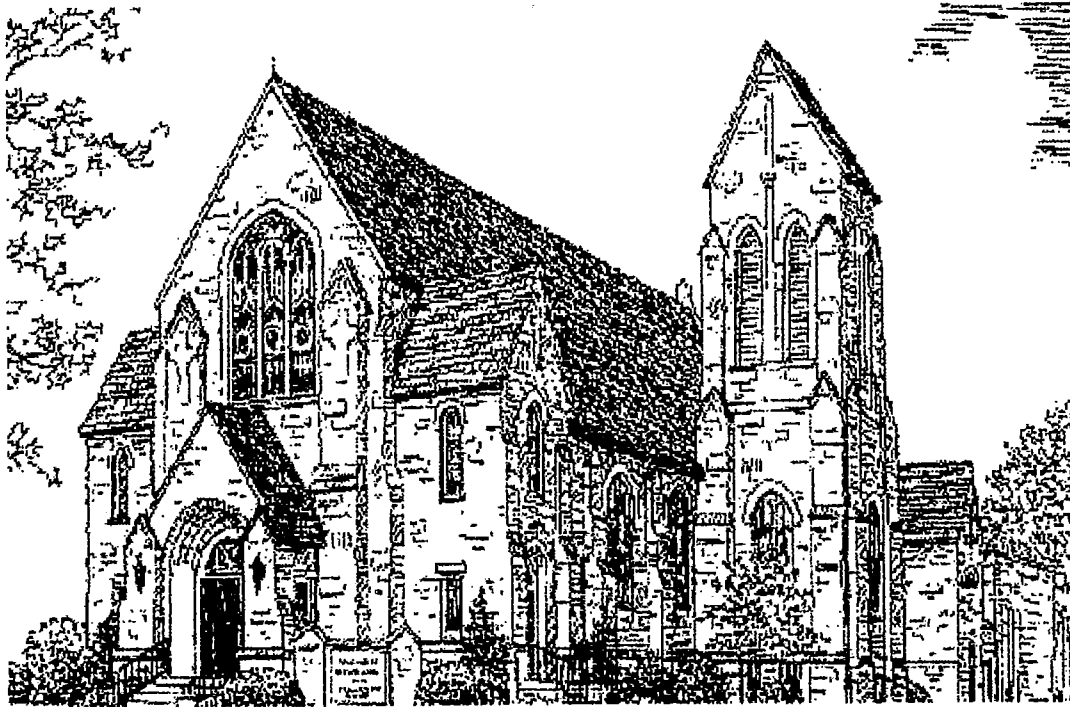

TWILIGHT REFLECTIONS

***“Accept what is, let go of what was, have faith in what will be.”
Sonia Ricotti***

As all of us have experienced, this has been a difficult time to stay connected, to communicate, and to plan, but please know that Pastor Scott, myself and the staff have continued to do our best to keep the work of the church moving forward. We have provided virtual worship services, daily devotionals, educational and fellowship opportunities during this time. We have also done our best to keep the committees meeting and planning. In my *Twilight Reflections* this month, I would like to share, more specifically the work of ***the Futuring Team*** and answer some questions that have come up over the months that I have been with you.

Why such a long interim?

Over the past twenty years or more, the churches and the way ministry is happening at the local level is changing in dramatic ways. This is particularly true in times of transition. This changing reality is creating more and more tension, anxiety, and uncertainty for our churches and our congregations. Given this reality, there is a greater need for congregations to reflect thoughtfully and intentionally about our life together under the guidance of temporary shepherds. In addition, the process for the church profile within the United Church of Christ has changed. The new profiles assume that the congregation has taken the appropriate time to develop their story and to define their hopes and their dreams prior to calling a settled pastor. Also, in this time of change, most Church leaders, across denominations are recommending that there be an interim time between pastors. It is recommended that for every five years a pastor has served, there should be a minimum of a one year interim. This provides for a smoother, less traumatic transition between a former pastor and a newly called pastor.

What has the Futuring Team been working on?

The Congregational profile includes three sections. The three questions are '***who are we?***', '***who is our neighbor?***' and '***what is God calling us to become?***' Since St. Paul UCC is a healthy congregation, the ***Futuring team*** has focused on these three questions during the interim. ***The Futuring team*** has completed the first two questions and we are currently working on the final question, '***what is God calling us to become?***'

Will the Futuring Team report their findings to the congregation?

Yes, the ***Futuring Team*** will make an initial presentation to the Church Council in August and the Council will be calling a special congregation meeting in September so that the ***Futuring Team*** will have an opportunity to share their findings with the congregation.

When will the Council appoint a Search Committee?

Currently, the Council is collecting names of individuals whom the members of the congregation believe will represent the membership and ministry of St. Paul UCC. The Council will make their selection from the names they receive. Once they have selected their first choices, they will call and invite the members to serve on the team. The Search Committee will be installed and commissioned on a Sunday in the fall. These are several questions that have come up over the time that I have been with you. Since new questions and concern come up on a regular basis, I am going to make an effort each Sunday to be outside after worship to talk to anyone who may have concerns or questions about the ***Futuring Team*** or the Search and Call process. Even if you do not have questions about these topics, I will be happy to talk and reconnect with you. Please know that I am happy to be available and to share time with you.

FUTURING TEAM UPDATE

Futuring Team June 22, 2020 The Futuring Team met via Zoom on June 22, 2020. In attendance were Nate Barron, Kristen Cunningham, Chloe Kelley (left meeting early), Kathy Cochran, Lynn DeTray, Kami Brough (joined the meeting at 7:30), Kimm Krehmke, Council President Nadine Thompson, and Pastor Dan Sather. Pastor Dan opened the meeting with a prayer. Earlier in the day Pastor Dan had sent out a spreadsheet of the responses we have received online from the congregation answering the three questions that we would have discussed in our small group Listening Sessions had we been able to meet that way. Pastor Dan had also sent out the calling lists that have been created during this time of COVID 19. We split these lists out between members of the group. Kathy Cochran - Town 1 Kami Brough and Chris DeTray - Town 2 Lynn DeTray - Town 3 and 4 Nate Barron - West and North Kimm Krehmke - South 1 and 2 Chloe Kelley and Josh Collins - Youth Group *Kristen will send us the link for the three Listening Session questions. *We are to call the people on our lists that have not responded to the questions yet or to gain some clarification of answers from those who have already responded. *Congregants are asked to respond to these questions as they would have prior to COVID 19. *Using the link Kristen sends us, we are to record each individual's answers. This will add their responses to the spreadsheet. *At the end of the questionnaire, record our initials and the call list the individual is on. *If no response, try 3 contact times and then cease contacting them. *Try to have finished by July 10, 2020. *If anyone is really upset, let Pastor Dan know. *Nate will update the congregation during the taping of the June 28 service. *The youth are meeting on June 28, 2020 at Pastor Scott and Kristen's house. Our next meeting will be at church in the Fellowship Hall on July 27, 2020 at 6:30. We will follow social distancing protocol.

Church Council Highlights

Monday, July 6, 2020

Council Members Present: Craig Collins, Christina Barron, Fred Schnoor, Karen Dages, Nadine Thompson, Ted Harder, Brad Hemminger, John Crosser, Denise DeTray, Sandy Shearon, Keith Green, Lucas Jess, Pastor Scott & Pastor Dan.

Nadine called the meeting to order at 6:35. Christina Barron shared the devotional & opening prayer.

Secretaries Minutes: Minutes from the June 1st regular council meeting were approved. Motion, Fred Schnoor, Second, Karen Dages. The Minutes of the June 24th Special Council meeting were also approved. Motion from Karen Dages, Second Fred Schnoor.

The treasurer's report was not available during the meeting. Denise DeTray emailed it to Council Tuesday, July 6, 2020. Sandy noticed an issue with the June Treasurer's report in the June Minutes while updating the July minutes. Denise DeTray confirmed that the June Minutes had the Benevolence income & expense numbers reversed. Sandy corrected the June minutes.

Safety and Security: nothing to report.

Trustees: They met Thursday, July 2. The Safety Project; angle parking ice/water issue Phase I is complete. Phase II thru DGL is the plans for construction to correct the issue. The Trustees bring to Council the recommendation to continue at the cost of \$4625.00. Brad Hemminger 2nd the recommendation. Council voted to continue to Phase II at said cost.

Pastor-Parish Relations: nothing to report.

Evangelism: nothing to report

Christian Education & Family Ministries and Youth Fellowship: The Graduating Seniors were tasked with writing a recap of what St. Paul meant for them. C.E. classes are prepping for virtual classes/sessions.

Mission & Stewardship: Noisy Offering in July is for Personal Care kits & School Kits. Next meeting scheduled for July 20th

Finance Team: They will meet July 30th with the Financial Secretary to review the 1st 6 months of 2020 & audit the Guild checkbook & bank statement.

Congregational Life and Fellowship: They met to discuss Anniversary Sunday & Rally Day Sunday.

They will be asking for funds for special handouts for Anniversary Sunday. Pastor Dan suggested that the 2021 Budget have funds listed for each team. Fred Schnoor indicated that could be done. The next meeting is scheduled for July 13.

Worship and Music: Met June 29th. The organist schedule is almost complete, including special music. They reviewed the copywrite laws & releases regarding our music & bulletins. Senior Choir & Hand Bells will be practicing on Thursday evenings. Their next meeting is scheduled for August 10 to review the Fall Music Program.

Associate Pastor's Report: The gardens are growing well. Planning to request vacation time soon.

Senior Pastor's Report: Shared Prayer Concerns/Hospitalized. Our website is up & running. A Special Thank You for the work with this goes out to Kristen Cunningham. Pastor Dan shared the minutes from the Futuring Teams recent meeting. He also shared the Adjusted Timeline for the Futuring Team & Search Team formation with Council. Council will set the number of members for the Search team Gather a list of volunteers, then from a list of congregation members willing to be on the Search Team select the appropriate cross-sectional team members. Once the Search Team is in place they can then meet with Pastor Dan Busch. Craig Collins has been approached by several members with concern over the amount of time it will take start to finish. The members who have approached him are concerned with the duration of the process and asked for communication of where things stand. Pastor Dan asked that he have those congregants contact him so that he can fully explain the process & ease their concerns. The Association Meeting is August 1st. Pastor Dan, Pastor Scott, Doug Ricci & Nadine will be attending. Pastor's report for June 2020 hours was emailed to all for review.

Old Business: none

New Business: Pastor Dan explained the proposal to establish a Personnel Committee that was emailed to Council prior to the meeting. It was noted that the Constitution will/may need updated to reflect changes. The current definition of the Vision Team includes a similar clause about assessments to be reviewed & possibly updated. Keith Green made a motion to table this proposal until the next meeting to provide time to review & create possible revisions to the current or for creation of a new policy. Brad Hemminger gave a 2nd. Denise DeTray made a motion to accept the resignation of Heidi Baumgartner as Youth Choir Director. Ted Harder gave the 2nd. Motion passed. After the acceptance of Heidi's resignation, the following items were discussed: Are there any Choir members moving up from one Choir to another? The Youth have indicated that they would like more upbeat songs. What is the criteria for each level of Choir? Lucas Jess suggested that until we can fill the Youth Choir Director position we ask the Youth to join the Senior Choir. Keith Green will present options to the Worship & Music Team at their next meeting. Worship & Music will access the age groups & make recommendations accordingly. There will be a Special Council meeting to present the recommendations from the Futuring Team – August 17th at 6:00 p.m. A Congregational Meeting for the Futuring Team to share their work is scheduled for September 27th. Work can begin on the Search Team selection in conjunction with the Futuring Team work.

Technology Team update: Keith Green met with Doug Beck. It was suggested that there be 3-4 'sound' people and that the current equipment needs to be located, assessed & then a review of what is needed. Inventory is complete for what they know exists. A search of the church may uncover other items to be inventoried. It was also stated that there should be Memorial Funds ear marked for sound system expenses. A Search Committee nominee/volunteer suggestion slip should be added to the Sunday Bulletin for the next 3 Sundays. The Nominating committee for next year's Council Member elections will consist of Brad Hemminger, Nadine Thompson, Fred Schnoor & Karen Dages. Due to Covid-19 social distancing requirements, contact spread of the virus, the lack of volunteers & the time involved to produce paper copies of The Chimes, it has been requested that the Chimes paper copy be addressed; i.e. do we continue with paper copies, can we have these printed, folded & addressed by a third party at a responsible price? Karen Dages will request a quote from Priesman Printery for producing The Chimes & this will be discussed at a future meeting.

The next regular meeting will be August 3, 2020 @ 6:30 p.m. with Brad Hemminger having devotional. Brad will also act as Head Usher for August services.

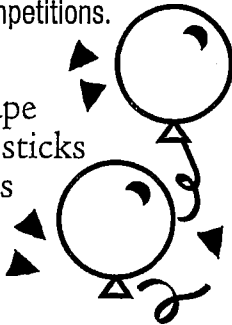

- Craft glue

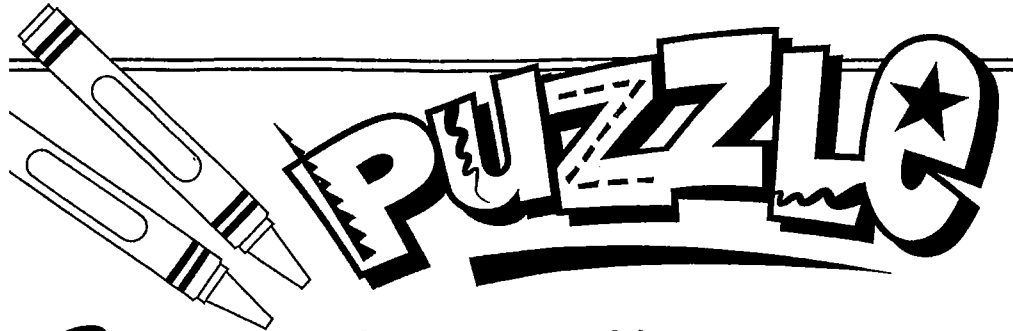


What you do:
