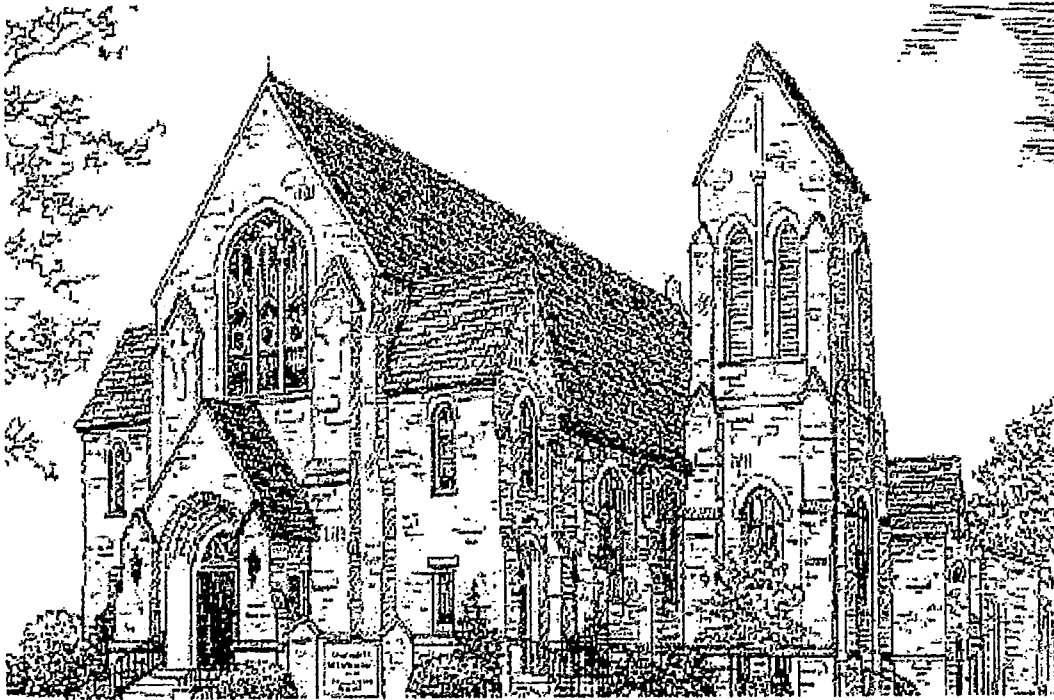

TWILIGHT REFLECTIONS

Do you know where you are going to? Do you like the things that life showing you?

Where are you going to? Do you know?

(Theme from Mahogany by Diana Ross, 1975)

Several years before I graduated from High School, Diana Ross came out with her song entitled, ***Theme from Mahogany***. I graduated from a small rural High School in Northwest Ohio. It was the tradition of this school for the Seniors to select their class song. It was a fun tradition, a different song for every graduating class from New Knoxville High School. My class selected Ross' song, *Theme from Mahogany*.

In transition times, whether graduating from High School or waiting to call a settled pastor, it is appropriate to ask questions about our life, our future, our hopes, and dreams. We want to allow time for the past to bless us and use the present to plan for the blessings of the future. This is what the *Futuring Team* has been doing, and they are excited to share their findings with the congregation.

During this transition time, we are answering the questions that Ross raises in the lyrics of her song: Do know where you are going? Do you like where St. Paul UCC is heading? Where are you in this journey? Do you know what you would like to do to be a part of our ministry? Within the United Church of Christ, we have a process by which pastors are called by the local congregation. In recent years, the profile of the local congregation asks three important questions about our life and our future together that will guide the discernment process for the pastor and the congregation. The three sections of the profile begin with three questions: *Who are we? Who is our Neighbor* and *Where is God calling us?* These three questions have guided the work of the *Futuring Team* and now they are ready to share their information with the congregation.

On Sunday, September 27th following worship, the Council has called a special congregational meeting for the *Futuring Team* to present their findings, suggestions, and ideas as we begin the process of completing our profile, circulating it to potential pastors, and to ultimately call a pastor who has the gifts and the vision to help our congregation move into our new future. Please mark your calendars for this important meeting and come prepared to receive the blessings, the vision, and the possibilities. Our lives, especially in this time, are constantly in transition, choices are made, and we are called to be partners in the ministry of St. Paul United Church of Christ and we hope that as we move forward into the future that you will want to be a big part of the ministry that is continually unfolding in new and not so new ways. This is our time; God's time to embrace the blessings of the future. Please come and be a part of our future, together.

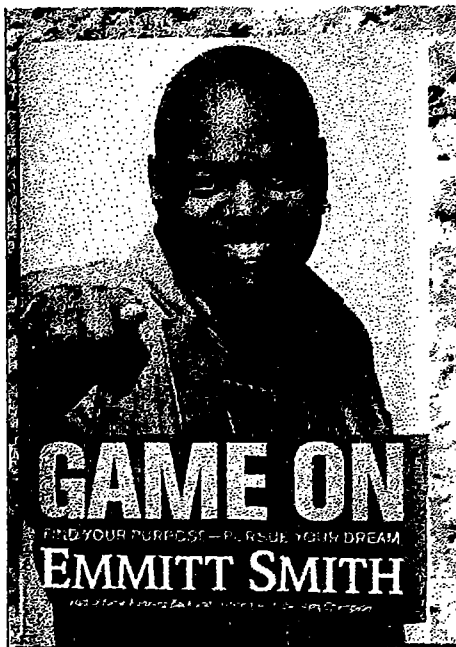

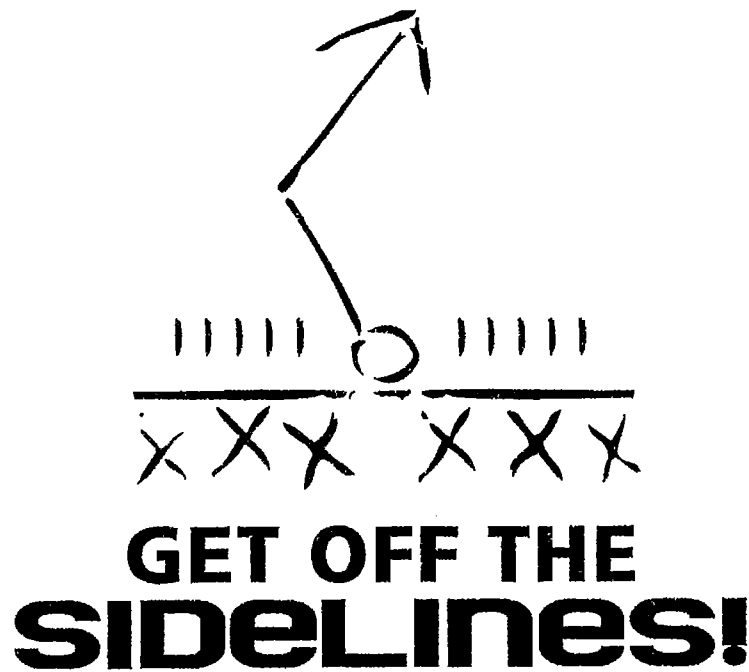

Monday, August 3, 2020

Council Members Present: Craig Collins, Christina Barron, Fred Schnoor, Karen Dages, Nadine Thompson, Ted Harder, Brad Hemminger, Denise DeTray, Sandy Shearon, Keith Green, Lucas Jess, Pastor Scott & Pastor Dan. John Crosser, absent. **Guests:** Kathy & Bob Steinmiller, Carol & Carroll Mylander, Bonnie Daniels & Dave & Beth Witt.

Nadine called the meeting to order & welcomed our guests. Brad Hemminger shared the devotional & opening prayer. The Guest attendees asked several questions about the 'color-code' system for how services will be held. Pastor Scott clarified the recommendations from the Safety Team about that system. Many concerns were expressed over parking lot services; sitting in car for long period of time, not feeling a 'connection' to others, not 'seeing' the Pastors. It was also expressed that the Office should stay open. The guests were thanked for their input. Nadine asked if they had any other questions or concerns & excused them from the continuing Council meeting. The guests Thanked Council for listening & then exited the meeting.

Secretaries Minutes: Minutes from the July 6th regular council meeting were approved. Motion, Fred Schnoor, Second, Brad Hemminger. The Minutes of the July 26th Special Council meeting were also approved. Motion from Christina Barron, Second Karen Dages.

Pastor Dan asked Denise to follow up with Cindy about a Thank you for the large monetary gift received in July. Treasurer's report was placed on file.

Safety and Security: Met July 29. Craig Collins made a motion to accept the team's recommendation & incorporate the guidelines for returning to the Sunday School classrooms on Rally Day, Sept 13, 2020. Brad Hemminger gave a 2nd. Motion passed. The Return to Church guidelines including the Color-Coded chart for *service type* was then discussed. Craig Collins then made the motion to continue with the Team's recommended color-coded chart for guidelines on services with more clarification on Extra Activities during Yellow or Orange levels. Sandy Shearon gave a 2nd. Motion Carried.

Congregational Life and Fellowship: The team asked for approval to spend ~\$150 on a special individually wrapped decorated Anniversary Sunday cookie. Approval was granted. Rally Sunday, Sept. 13 plans were discussed & the recommendation as presented was sent back to the team for further review. The next meeting is August 24th

Trustees: Tom Witt will be handling the Boiler Testing in the future. Duane Jess is gathering quotes for a new push mower to replace the current mower that is no longer working.

Pastor-Parish Relations: nothing to report.

Evangelism: nothing to report

Christian Education & Family Ministries and Youth Fellowship: Met via Zoom on July 23rd. Mess'd Fest alternative is being sought-perhaps a kayak trip. Confirmation letters were sent out, Confirmation orientation is tentatively planned for Sept. 2nd. The team is considering sponsoring a \$200 YF

scholarship; supporting details to be decided during August meeting. 2020 Fall Sunday School program is being reviewed for both an in class and virtual version. Last year's teachers are being contacted for their input in developing a safe program and soliciting their input so that they are comfortable with either solution. A virtual VBS program has been planned for the week of Aug. 10th. Renew the Green is the theme, centered around the Parable of the Soul. Keith Green of Congregational Life team participated in the last meeting to synchronize plans and ideas for Rally Sunday. This remains a work in progress and will be dependent on the status of Covid in our area. The next meeting is Aug. 5th

Mission & Stewardship: The Team filled in and adjusted Noisy Offering schedule to make up for past decreased Noisy Offerings and canceled mission trips. They are donating \$500 to BCS schools for teachers to purchase school supplies for students in need. They approved Discretionary Funds guidelines for the Pastors to follow to provide financial help to those that inquire of same. The next meeting is TBD.

Finance Team: They met July 30th with the Financial Secretary to review the 1st 6 months of 2020. Cindy is doing a wonderful job. They will be auditing the Guild checkbook & bank statement soon. They are planning a team meeting for addressing the upcoming budget, as well.

Worship and Music: nothing to report. Their next meeting is scheduled for August 10 to review the Fall Music Program.

Associate Pastor's Report: Pastor Scott has a wedding in the sanctuary in Sept & asked for assistance from council for Safety guideline support. The Church gardens have already produced more than 100 pounds of produce. Pastor Scott expressed a deep appreciation for the hard work of the 'Raised Bed families' and other participants in the Church Gardens' success. He also shared his monthly activity report with council.

Senior Pastor's Report: Pastor Dan shared prayer concerns & hospitalization updates with council. He then shared the Futuring Team update/minutes with council. Pastor Dan asked the Evangelism Team to review old/stagnant email accounts & get updated information where possible. The Mail Folders for Council are now located in the Adult Sunday School room. Pastor Dan also shared his monthly activity report via email with council.

Old Business: Suggestions for the parking lot service from Brad Hemminger, Deb Green & Doug Beck were discussed. Parking everyone in one central location will be tried at the next parking lot service.

New Business: With much sadness & heart felt deliberation, Nadine Thompson presented Council with her letter of resignation. Sandy Shearon made a motion to regretfully but supportively accept Nadine's resignation. Christina Barron gave a remorseful 2nd. Motion Carried. Brad Hemminger will step in as Council President for the August meeting. Pastor Dan suggested Council Re-Organize at the September meeting. We will appoint a new Council member at the meeting to fill the vacant spot thru year end when election for that spot will be held.

There will be a Special Council meeting to present the recommendations from the Futuring Team – August 17th at 6:00 p.m.

The next regular meeting will be September 8, 2020 @ 6:30 p.m. with Sandy Shearon having devotional. Sandy is to act as Head Usher for September services.

St Paul UCC Service & Event Guidance

Virtual service can be done at anytime in addition to the in person or parking lot services.

From the Ottawa County Health Department

- A person identified as a close contact will be asked to quarantine for 14 days from their last exposure to the positive individual. A close contact is defined as a person that had close contact (within 6 feet) of the infected individual, did not have on a facial covering, and had more than 15 minutes of exposure to the infected individual. Contacts of a contact do not need to quarantine until the contact they had contact with becomes symptomatic.



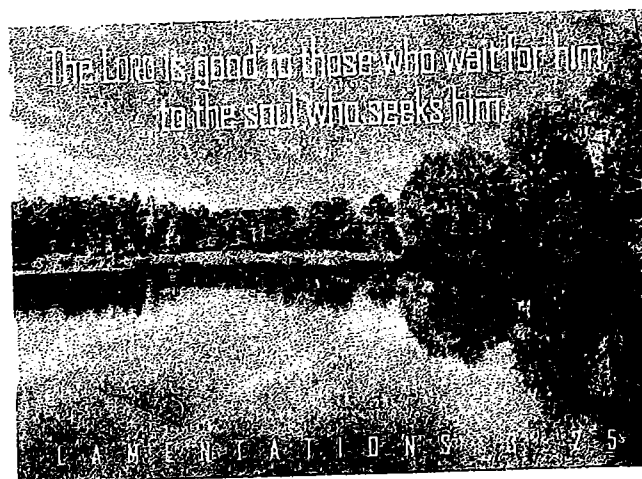

A BUSHEL OF BOOKS



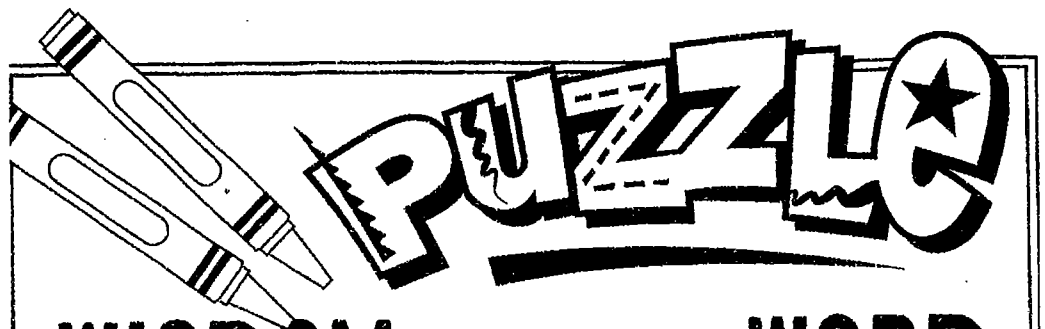
Design a handy bag to tote your books this fall.

What you need:

- Plain canvas bag
- Cardboard scrap
- Acrylic paints (2 colors)
- 2 small paper plates
- Apple
- Knife (and adult help)
- Foam brush
- Scrap paper

What you do:

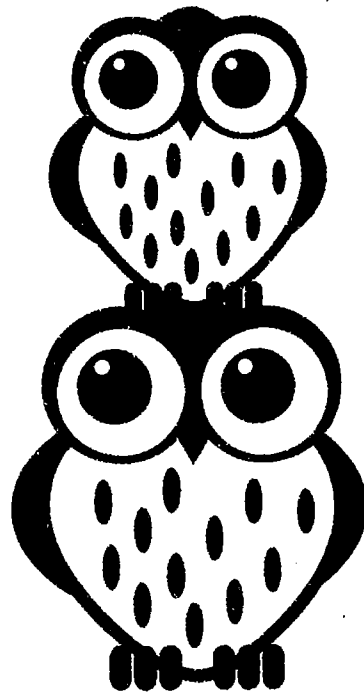
1. Lay the bag flat on a table, and place cardboard inside for protection.
2. Pour a paint dollop on each plate.
3. Slice the apple in half, keeping the core intact.
4. Brush a thin layer of paint on the cut side of an apple half. Practice making stamps on scrap paper. Use the other color on the other apple half.
5. Paint and stamp the bag with your final design. When dry, remove the cardboard.
6. Use the bag for school and Sunday school. Happy reading!

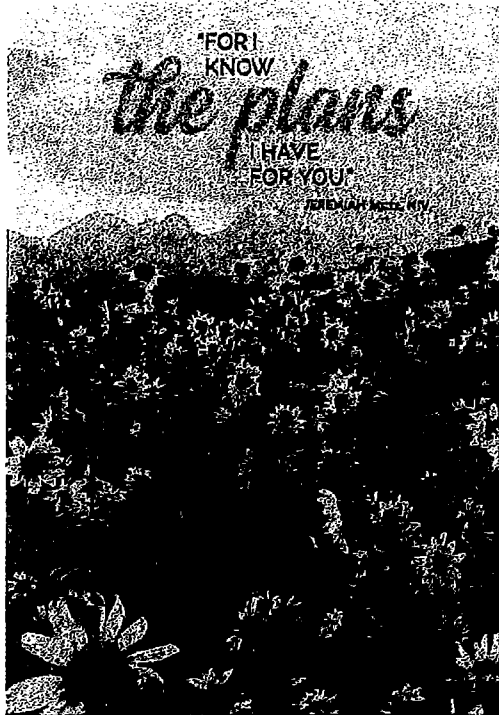
